

## **JED 2017 served as a catalyst to inspire, empower and connect dental technicians.**

March 9, 2017 (North Haven, Conn.) - On Feb. 24, 2017 nearly 200 dental laboratory owners and technicians filled Jensen Dental's Education Day lecture hall at the Swissôtel in Chicago and an additional 200 technicians and laboratory owners joined remotely via the streaming Live webcast. It was a very fascinating learning experience for everybody including the instructors, as the program culminated with all three of the instructors working on exactly the same case. Working with a single patient, the four-unit anterior case was restored using traditionally, minimally layered and monolithic techniques. In addition, at the conclusion of the individual lectures there was a panel discussion that all four presenters participated in while fielding questions with the participants.
